GAME ON!



This spring, the Student Center game room was converted into a state-of-the-art Esports lounge, providing an opportunity for Curry students to engage in collaborative gaming experiences. This highly anticipated initiative offers our students the chance to engage in competitive gaming, fostering essential skills like critical thinking, communication, and teamwork, all while having an absolute blast.

In recent years it has been discovered that gaming and Esports at the college level, especially in dedicated spaces like the Curry Esports lounge, plays a crucial role in enhancing connectedness among college students (all in moderation, of course!). This, in turn, contributes significantly to student wellness and satisfaction.

With this in mind, Assistant Director of Intramurals, Club Sports, and Fitness Center Operations Kevin Blackmur identified an opportunity to transform the current game room into an Esports lounge. Blackmur emphasized, “Esports is rapidly growing in global education, and by embracing this initiative, Curry can position itself as innovative and ahead of the curve.”

Recognizing that students are already engaged in gaming within their residence halls, Blackmur envisioned a space where students from all areas of campus can gather to create shared memories. Equipped with ten desktop computers, the lounge accommodates students interested in both competitive and noncompetitive gaming. Functioning like an “open gym,” any student is welcome to drop in and use the computers at their convenience.



“The Esports lounge is a great addition to the Student Center and helps accommodate the growing population of those interested in gaming on campus by providing everyone a place to meet,” said senior Tom Crisafulli.

Erik Müürisepp, Curry’s Vice President of Student Affairs and Dean of Students, shared his excitement, expressing, “I am very excited that we have this cutting-edge space in the Student Center that allows students to game together with other Curry students.”

Beyond gaming, Esports highlights the significance of community-building. The program is a part of the National Esports Collegiate Conference (NECC), which helps facilitate connections not only among Curry students, but also enables them to engage with friends from other schools that are a part of the conference. This affiliation also opens the door to nationwide connections with peers from other programs, fostering relations that might not have otherwise been possible.

The creation of this space has played a significant role in fostering a sense of community among those involved in its development. Müürisepp notes his pride in those dedicated to bringing it to life, stating, “I am really proud of the cross-campus team that has worked hard to make this Esports lounge a reality.”

DR. RYAN THEROUX

Professor, General Education

Fueled by the outstanding mentorship he received throughout his academic career, Dr. Ryan Theroux is on a mission to provide the same experience for Curry College students.

Theroux is a Professor of General Education at Curry, focusing his teaching and research on how the first-year transition can lay the foundation for a valuable college experience, and more so, a fulfilling life. But perhaps the greatest pillar to higher education success? The meaningful relationships.

“It’s about belonging. It’s about people. It’s about community. It’s about feeling welcome and that’s what you’re going to remember,” he said. “You’re going to remember someone that really influenced you or played a big part in your life at a very vulnerable time. That’s what it’s all about.”

Theroux appreciates the diverse set of experiences that each Curry student brings to the table, and embraces the grit persistence factor of engaging all that he has the opportunity to teach. “When you teach, you have to learn to roll with the differences and being uncomfortable when things don’t go the way they’re supposed to,” said Theroux. “I love that challenge of engaging my students at Curry. That’s probably my favorite part about teaching.”

Throughout his own academic journey and inspired by his mentors, Theroux pursued Higher Education as a program of study, fascinated by the different aspects of it all. He received his Doctorate in Higher Education Leadership at the University of Nevada, and has since published numerous articles on the first-year experience, campus culture, and more.

In the spring of 2024, Theroux embarked upon his first sabbatical, researching the first-year experience at colleges around the world, hoping to gain valuable feedback and knowledge to enhance the program at Curry. “I feel like what I’m doing is interesting to me, but it’s also of interest to people at Curry, which is really cool,” he said. “It feels rewarding.” And even though he’s not physically on campus, he still checks his email every day, just in case a student needs him. “I’m still going to do whatever I can to help them,” he said. Because, at the end of the day, the meaningful relationships that are forged on a tight-knit campus such as Curry are what truly create a meaningful college experience, and beyond.

At Curry College, Taylor Nault has found her people.

Yearning for a close-knit and safe environment for her college journey, Nault immediately fell in love with the Milton Campus and its inclusive community. But for the junior Early Childhood Education major, college is what you make of it, and to Nault, that means getting involved, and paying it forward.

“In order to have a fulfilling college experience, it’s so important to be open-minded,” said Nault. “Getting involved in different clubs and organizations has really taught me how I can be a leader and a role model to others.”

Nault’s involvement on campus stretches far and wide as a dedicated member of the Student Government Association, LEAD Committee, the Curry Cares Club, the Equestrian Club, an Orientation Leader, and more. She also benefits from fundamental support from the Program for Advancement of Learning (PAL), and is a proud Dwarfism Awareness Activist.

“The Curry community is really important to me as a person who struggles with a disability,” she said. “I have been so successful here with all the academic and peer support I’ve been given.”

Inspired by a life-changing relationship with one of her medical doctors, Nault decided to pursue a degree in Early Childhood Education to pay it forward, and to make a lasting impression on children in the classroom. “I want to help change children’s lives,” she said. “I truly believe that if you can make a difference to children at a young age, they’re going to be more successful in their careers.”

Nault is well on her way to making a positive impact on young minds as a preschool teacher at the Gilson JCC Early Learning Center. As a key part of the Curry Early Childhood Education curriculum, this field experience has provided her with the opportunity to implement child-appropriate learning activities and lesson plans while fostering a supportive learning environment.

“With one-on-one support from my professors who understand how to properly accommodate my learning needs, I feel that I’m set up for success,” she said. “My Curry professors have made a significant impact on my life, and I hope to do the same with my future students.”

If Laurie Lessage '10 had the choice to hire an intern from Curry versus any other college in the world, she would take the Curry student every day - and twice on Sunday. That's because she knows first-hand that the Curry student will be hungry for the opportunity, take on every given task, and work through any challenge-just like she did.

Throughout her career, Lessage has always proven herself as an ambitious leader and a lifelong learner. At Curry, she served as class president, a resident assistant, and pursued various internships which ultimately led to her current role as Chief Financial Officer of Big Brothers Big Sisters of New York City.

During her senior year, Lessage completed an internship with Ayanna Pressley, who had just been elected as the first woman of color to serve on the Boston City Council. Lessage was captivated by the passion that Pressley led with, particularly with issues concerning women and children.

“After my internship with Ayanna Pressley, I realized I wanted to make a positive impact in the community and decided to get my master’s degree in public administration,” said Lessage. “She focused strongly on advocating for young people and women, and I knew that was something I wanted to do. It’s not every day that you get to see someone in leadership that looks like you, and I was truly inspired by her.”

As a lifelong learner and early adopter, Lessage has spent the past decade pursuing certifications, degrees, and other opportunities to better herself professionally. Combined with her tenacity, drive, and leadership skills that first bloomed at Curry, she now leads the financial operations of one of the largest non-profits in the country.

“Something I learned at Curry that I carry with me every day is the ‘we’ mindset. I learned how to collaborate as a team, partner with my peers, and lean on faculty for help,” she said. “I was well-supported at Curry, and also took advantage of the PAL program which was helpful in my transition to college.”

Lessage now leads a large team of high-performance individuals that she built from scratch, and is responsible for financial planning, reporting, accounting, risk management, grants and fundings, and tax compliance at Big Brothers Big Sisters. In her current role, she utilizes the leadership skills, grit, and team-oriented mindset that she developed during her undergraduate experience.
