

Snow Emergency Procedures

During the snow season, please be aware of the following snow removal and driving policies and procedures.

PARKING BAN:

In case of significant snow fall, to ensure proper cleaning of the roadways and parking the College may call for a parking ban. When a parking ban occurs, notifications will be posted in the Residence Halls and emailed to students' Curry College email accounts.

If a **parking ban** is called, students will be required to park in one of the following locations:

Leaving for the night, weekend, winter break, etc?

In the event that it may snow and you are leaving campus for an extended period of time without your vehicle, please make arrangement to have your vehicle moved as needed, or you **MUST** move it to the Mayflower lot, if you live on the north side of campus and the Cottage lot, if you live on the south side. If you fail to do this, your vehicle may be towed at your expense. Under unusual circumstances, your vehicle may need to be moved again from the Mayflower or Cottage lots to another designated lot. If arrangements are not made to accommodate this, your vehicle may need to be towed to another location on campus at your expense.

DRIVING BAN:

If snow conditions worsen, creating emergency conditions, a **Driving Ban** will be issued. Notice of a driving ban would be posted in the Residence Halls and emailed to students' Curry College email accounts.

If a **Driving Ban** is called, your car will need to stay in the designated parking lots until the driving ban is lifted. During a driving ban, the only vehicles allowed to operate on campus are Public Safety, Buildings and Grounds and other essential personnel, or any outside emergency vehicles. Failure to obey the driving ban or reckless driving will result in disciplinary actions, \$100 fine and suspension

of driving privileges.

In the event of a driving ban, any vehicle entering the campus will be informed that a driving ban is in effect and they will be directed to one of the designated parking lots.

\$200 Towing Policy:

Students who fail to move their vehicles as outlined in the above policies will have their car towed and charge a \$100 fine as well as a \$100 emergency parking ban ticket, for a total of \$200.

For Up-To-Date Snow Emergency Information:

A snow emergency sign will be placed at the front gate indicating which lots are open.

Students may also call the snow emergency hotline, at the on campus ext. 2075 or the off campus number, 617-333-2075. **Please do not call Public Safety.**

Curry Student Center and Dining Services:

During a snow storm, every effort will be made to keep the **Student Center** and **Marketplace** open its standard business hours, and to keep the Fitness Center open until 11pm. Efforts will also be made to keep the **Late Night Window** open the normal scheduled times, but we might be unable to, so please plan accordingly and make arrangements to meet your meal requirements during the Marketplace meal plan hours. If the College closes, the Student Center and Dining Services will go to weekend hours.

Please Be Aware:

It is always a good idea to keep a hat, gloves and shovel in your car in case of an emergency!! Students are responsible for checking residence hall postings and email notices for updated information on parking and driving bans, as well as when to move their cars to a clean lot within 48hrs after a major snow storm.
