**CURRY HOCKEY TEAM PARTICIPATES IN BOSTON BRUINS FOUNDATION  
“SKATE TO EDUCATE” PROGRAM**

**MILTON, Mass.** – On Friday, March 23rd, the Curry College Men’s Ice Hockey Team played host as the Boston Bruins Foundation held its second "Skate to Educate" program of the year. The innovative program, sponsored by BJ's Wholesale Clubs, is designed to allow children from a variety of communities to visit an area ice hockey rink, tour the locker rooms, skate on the ice, and interact with hockey stars from around New England. Foundation Director of Development and former NHL referee and player Paul Stewart was on hand to oversee the event.

In attendance were approximately 60-70 inner city middle school students from Boston. For two hours, they skated with current Colonels’ players at the Max Ulin Rink in Milton, and then had lunch with the players at the Alumni Recreation Center on the Curry College campus.

Like the spokes on a hub, the Boston Bruins Foundation was established to reach out to all areas of New England with the purpose of being the best neighbors and friend's possible.
