To be admitted to Curry College's M.Ed. Program, you must have successfully passed the MTEL Communication and Literacy Skills Test (CLST). In addition, you need to submit your score for the MTEL General Curriculum: Math Subtest. Both exams are administered several times throughout the year at various locations throughout Massachusetts. Deadlines for test dates vary and you should plan to register early to avoid paying late charges and penalties.

Math Review Seminar

Enroll in this workshop to better prepare yourself for graduate school, for the elementary classroom, and for the MTEL General Curriculum: Math Subtest. Taught by Dr. Tom Gorsuch, this seven session workshop is designed to refresh prospective elementary teachers' knowledge of mathematical reasoning and problem solving, number theory, algebra, geometry, and data analysis. In addition, the workshop provides methodologies for addressing questions that may appear on the MTEL General Curriculum: Math Subtest. Taking this test is a requirement for admission into Curry College's M.Ed. program, however passing it is not a requirement for admissions.
