- Invited Summer 2019 to assist with a group of professional from around USA to take part in a think tank helping
 to advise colleagues at the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine (PCOM) to problem-solve Opioid Use
 Disorders in the city of Philadelphia (Summer 2019).
- Volunteered services to Board of Directors for Learning Disabilities Worldwide Congress, to help with leadership and programming with other countries in globally for children, youth and families with disabilities. Based in Massachusetts (2019-2020).
- Asked and appointed to serve as the acting CEO for the Learning Disabilities Worldwide Congress Annual Conference in Houston, Texas. The CEO was unable to attend due to illness (September/October 2019).
- Lifetime Achievement Award (March 2020) from the American Board of School Neuropsychology and the School Neuropsychology. Originally the international conference was to be held on the ground in Savannah, Georgia, but due to COVID-19 the entire international conference was held live virtually for three days. The award is given to honor mentorship, leadership, and national and international impact in the field.
- Acknowledged by the School Neuropsychology Institute contributing a written piece focusing on a review of research on a study of Child Neurology involving A-D/HD and Autism Spectrum Disorders involving children with 22q11.2deletion syndrome. The piece was placed in the School Neuropsychology Newsletter which is distributed nationally and internationally (Fall 2019).

- With three students, earned national certification through the Massachusetts General Hospital/Harvard University Medical School Certification Program. During the curriculum training, developed by The Fatherhood Project at MGH, students learned how to facilitate ten sessions of high impact evidenced-based programming for mothers and fathers who are in recovery from Substance Use Disorder (June 2019). The students are now able to add the training to their resume and can implement the program during teaching, within an internship experience, and/or when "seeking employment in the field of addictions counseling."
- World Summit on Psychiatry Disorders, Mental Health and Wellness held on June 24 and 25, 2019 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, keynote presentation of "The opioid craving brain: Utilizing adolescent neuropsychological assessment and psychological-behavioral intervention approaches for improved treatment outcomes." Received three awards including Recognition of the Keynote presentation; Recognition for chairing sessions involving wellness, psychiatry, forensic and emergency Mental Health; and Certification of Appreciation as one of the honorary members of the organizing Committee.
- Along with three students, received a certificate for completion of the course, "Neuropsychiatry: A
 Comprehensive Update," led by Harvard Medical School on October 24 and 25, 2019. The course was
 part of a post-graduate conference which allowed students to see how theory applies to real-world
 practice. The course focused on brain-behavior relationships and skills for diagnostic work-up and treatment
 of patients/clients with neuropsychiatric disorders. Students were able to review cutting-edge clinical
 research, evidence-based interventions and practical guidelines for medical and mental health clinicians.

 a certificate of completion to place on their resume of the extensive training they received.
