

Pathway to MSN for Registered Nurses with a Non-Nursing Bachelor's Degree

This entry into Curry College's Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) is designed for the registered nurse with an associate's degree or diploma in nursing who also holds a bachelor's degree in another field.

The following prerequisite courses must be completed before beginning MSN courses:

Course #	Title	Credits
Math 1150	Statistics	3
NSG 2100	RN Transition to Baccalaureate Nursing	4

The following courses must be completed within one year of starting MSN courses:

Course #	Title	Credits
NSG 3032	Population Health in the Community	5

** With the exception of Statistics, the above courses must be taken at Curry College unless approved by the MSN Program Director*

Admission

Students are conditionally accepted into the Pathway MSN program pending successful completion of the above-named courses within the timeframe specified and a minimum grade of "B-" for the Nursing courses and "C-" for Statistics.

Tuition

The tuition for the undergraduate courses listed above (MATH 1150, NSG 2100, NSG 3032) will be charged at the tuition rate in effect at the time of registration. For MSN courses, students will be charged the per credit MSN tuition rate.

Registration

Registration for the above-named courses is open on a space available basis. Students should check the CE Course Schedule Guide or website at www.curry.edu/cegrad and register for courses in a timely manner. MATH 1150 and NSG 2100 should be taken in the term prior to beginning MSN courses. NSG 3032 must be taken concurrently or later; but within 1 year of starting MSN courses. This pathway assumes transfer of prior coursework in Anatomy and Physiology, Microbiology, and Human Growth and Development from the completed nursing program.
