RWE Approval Process:

- Step 1 Submit this completed form and your proposal/syllabus, along with other relevant materials to the RWE Coordinator *at least two weeks prior* to the Faculty Meeting at which you hope to get the RWE Enhanced Course approved.
- Step 2 Finalize the course proposal/enhancements, as per the recommendations of the RWE Coordinator.
- Step 3 Submit the course proposal/enhancements to the appropriate Area or Division for approval.
- Step 4 Submit the course proposal/enhancements to GECC as per their timeline for reviewing course proposals and enhancements.

Please feel free to meet with RWE Coordinator, Dr. Heather Falconer (<u>heather.falconer@curry.edu</u>), at any step of the process, even if you are just considering ideas for an RWE Enhanced course in the future.

Checklist: RWE enhanced courses should fulfill the following requirements.

Students produce a minimum of 15 pages of both low-stakes (writing-to-learn and graded for completion) and high stakes (formal and graded according to specified criteria) writing assignments.

_____Students practice the following:

- ____ pre-writing
- _____ multiple drafts
- professor feedback on drafts to aid in the revision and editing process
- revision of drafts to enhance thinking and writing skills
- reflective writing that articulates growth and/or changes in their writing abilities.

Students complete an inquiry-based writing project (provide example or assignment).

Students analyze rhetorical structures used by writers in order to practice the skills of analysis and summary, as well as to learn how writers structure their content.

Students use writing as a form of thinking & problem-solving within the discipline.

Students learn how to appropriately use and document sources within the field.

_Students attend to the mechanics, punctuation, and structure of their written documents.

- 1. Describe how you use writing to teach subject-area content.
