FACTS YOU SHOULD KNOW

- Curry College's priority deadline for applying for financial aid is **June 1, 2020** for entering students.
- Curry College's Federal School Code is **002143**.
- After you complete the FAFSA, Curry College will determine your eligibility from the following sources: Curry College, the State which you live in and the Federal Government.
- Award letters are sent to **NEW ACCEPTED** students beginning the first week of December, 2019 and are initially based upon information on the FAFSA.
- Awards are subject to review and adjustments may be based on review of submitted documents.
- Awards may contain any of the following types of aid: *Grants and Scholarships, Work Study and/or Loans*.

SCHOLARSHIP SEARCHES

Curry College encourages students to seek outside scholarships to help meet the cost of education. These outside scholarships are awarded independent of any federal, state or institutional aid awarded by Curry. Students should never pay a fee for a scholarship search service.

Entering Students Applying for Financial Aid at Curry College

Curry College strongly encourages all students to apply for financial aid. Applying for financial aid is a simple process for all institutional, federal and state financial aid.

All prospective students are eligible to apply for financial aid as long as the student will be enrolled in a degree program, is a U.S. citizen or permanent resident, has a high school diploma and meet all other general eligibility requirements for federal financial aid.

How do I start?

Apply for an FSA-ID, if you do not already have an established FSA-ID

- Students and parents should apply for a Federal Student ID (FSA-ID) at fsaid.ed.gov. This allows you to electronically sign the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). At least one parent and the student must have their own FSA-ID

Submit the FAFSA

- The 2020-2021 FAFSA may be submitted at fafsa.gov, beginning on October 1, 2019. Curry College's federal code number is **002143**
- Use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer your **2018** federal tax information directly to the FAFSA if eligible

Curry's priority deadline for applying is **March 1, 2020**

What other documents are required?

Students may be asked to submit additional documentation to determine or finalize their financial aid eligibility due to verification. Verification is a process confirming information reported on the FAFSA. It involves the collection and review of additional documents specified by the Department of Education. Student Financial Services will reach out to students individually with requests for additional documentation/information.

All requested documentation and information should be submitted directly to the Student Financial Services Office by email, fax or mail. Please include the student's name and Curry College ID on all documentation submitted.

Note: Students and/or parents sending personal information, such as a copy of a Federal tax return, to our office should send it via fax or encrypted e-mail.
