Confidential Emotional Support

On-Campus:

The **Curry College Counseling Center** provides a confidential space for students to receive emotional support and information about campus and community resources, including medical support, and to discuss their options, like whether or not to report.

Off-Campus:

A New Day victim advocates can talk by phone or come to campus. They provide free and confidential counseling and advocacy to individuals impacted by sexual violence and/or relationship violence.

Victim Reporting Options

- Title IX Coordinators offer information to students about reporting options on and off-campus and ensure that complaints are addressed appropriately.
- Students may choose to report to local police. Public Safety can assist students who want to pursue a criminal complainant.
- The College and criminal processes are separate and victims have the right to participate in one and not the other or both.
- *Students will not be subject to the Community Standards process for being under the influence of alcohol or other drugs at the time of an alleged incident of sexual misconduct or for not following the College's policies around Covid-19.*

Medical Care

On-campus:

Health Services provides free and confidential medical services (including STI testing and emergency contraception) and referrals.

Off-campus:

Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center is a SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner)-certified site. SANE-certified nurses are specifically trained to perform exams and collect forensic evidence from sexual assault survivors. You can seek medical care whether or not you report the assault to the police. You may receive free care and do not have to use your insurance.

Housing, Academic & Other Accommodations

Title IX Coordinators offer guidance and support regarding academic, housing, transportation, and other needs to address safety concerns or the impact of trauma.

Accommodations may include housing changes, class reassignment, no contact orders, extension on an assignment, or others, based on situation. More information can be found at www.curry.edu/handbook.

Students can also receive housing assistance through the Office of Residence Life and Housing.
