On-Campus: <b>Rachael Cina</b> , Curry's Sexual Violence Prevention Educator, provides a confidential space for students to receive emotional support and information about campus and community resources, including medical support, and to discuss their options, like whether or not to report, as do staff at the <b>Counseling Center</b> . Off-Campus:	<ul> <li>Title IX Coordinators offer information to students about reporting options on and off-campus and ensure that complaints are addressed appropriately.</li> <li>Students may choose to report to local police. Public Safety can assist students who want to pursue a criminal complainant.</li> <li>The College and criminal processes are separate and victims have the right to participate in one and not the other or both.</li> </ul>	
<b>A New Day</b> and <b>DOVE</b> victim advocates can talk by phone or come to campus. They provide free and confidential counseling and advocacy to individuals impacted by sexual violence and/or relationship violence.	Worried about "getting in trouble?" Students who report sexual misconduct will not be subject to disciplinary action for a violation of policy related to the incident.*
